NEXT GEN TEAM

The Next Gen team was birthed out of the elder's strategic planning process (led by Brian Rupe) as a strategic alliance with the goal of answering this question: "How do we steward a shared vision for fathering and mothering the next generation here on campus between all the "next generation ministries" (ACTS, NCS, WOTL's children's and youth ministries, and our homeschool families). This team is co-led by Sam Mayes and Joey Stontz with the oversight of Brian Rupe and the elders. The team has representatives from each next gen ministry: NCS (Jake Givand, Beth Dvorak, Lance Wonders, Derek Sontowski), ACTS (Lance Wonders), WOTL's children's and youth ministries (Kyle & Ellie Salley and Sam and Jamie Mayes), and homeschool families (Sharon Brodin, Andrew Anderson and Joey & Nicole Stontz).

To start, the team crafted a discipleship road map for our young people from birth into their college years with 10 key mile markers (baby dedication, salvation, first Bible, water baptism, Holy Spirit baptism, service & outreach, retreats, participation in a discipleship group, sharing the gospel, and a gap year program upon graduating from high school).

Secondly, the team designed four "unifying events" with the dual purpose of 1) coalescing each of the next gen ministries on campus for the purpose of 2) helping our children and students arrive at these key destination points in their discipleship journey. In other words, we want each of these ministries to be working together and pulling in the same direction for maximum impact.

The events that the team organized were:

Family Fun Night on September 28th where around 300 people from both WOTL and NCS enjoyed food, fellowship, and fun. It was a substantial and formative way to begin aligning our next gen ministries.

The **Harvest Festival** on October 28th, 2022 was designed as an alternative event to Halloween and has been organized by NCS in the past, but this year had help from many volunteers from WOTL and garnered the same level of participation (over 300+ people). There were games, food trucks, hay rides, and a whole lot of fun for the kids (and parents!).

The **Holy Spirit Encounter Night** (February 17th, 2023) was birthed out of a desire for our young people to arrive at a prominent mile marker: being baptized and be immersed in the Holy Spirit. We had a night of powerful worship, the word, and testimonies, where many young people were prayed for to receive the Holy Spirit, and several people gave their lives to Jesus!

The **Blaine Garage Sales Outreach** keyed in on two of our mile markers: "service & outreach" and "sharing the gospel." The influence and prominence of our church and school grew exponentially from this event as hundreds of people from around the North Metro flocked to our campus for free parking and food trucks. We had a great group of volunteers. John Zupek led prayer with live worship from several of our worship leaders in the sanctuary during the event. Mary Akehurst led and sent out evangelism teams that shared the gospel and prayed for people (and at least one person surrendered their life to Jesus)! The food shelf passed out hundreds of free water bottles and snacks. There was always a line at the food trucks. And the Way of the Lord website drew in over 1,500 unique views over that weekend.

And Jesus gets the win for all of this.

Also, one of the unifying results of this team was the inclusion of all of Way of the Lord's homeschool students being able to attend Northside Christian School chapel services.

The Next Gen Team will now be focusing on one event per season:

FALL 2023: Harvest Festival

WINTER 2024: A Holy-Spirit-centric event TBD **SPRING 2024**: Blaine Garage Sales Outreach

SUMMER 2024: TBD

There are also other ideas the Next Gen team is exploring for how to further our unity of the vision to love and disciple, not only the young, but every generation into God's family.

DEVELOPMENT

While we remain committed to our vision of creating a space that fosters and can accommodate increased enrollment, community engagement, and to ultimately prepare us for the last days, we feel it is crucial to continue to dream, strategize, and assess best practices both fiscally and logistically before making any final decisions to begin a capital campaign. Our dedicated building development team, led by Hans Martens, is working extremely hard to gather all the necessary information for and from Vanman Architects and will continue to evaluate the potential impact of their designs. We assure you

that your opinions and concerns are of utmost importance to us, and we will keep you informed at every step of the way. We invite you to join us in prayer for wisdom and discernment as we navigate this exciting yet challenging phase together.

Ministry Reports

ACTS BIBLE COLLEGE

ACTS, since it moved here from Eden Prairie in 2006, has been the primary adult education ministry arm at Way of the Lord. After its president, Don Pfotenhauer, experienced debilitating health issues in 2020, we shifted the emphasis from focusing on Bible College degrees to being more "seeker-friendly" in our classes.

Among the more popular have been

- a study of American culture and government (Christianity, the Constitution, and Capitalism);
- the NT Letter to the Hebrews (on the real Jesus, real faith, and real salvation);
- the NT Book of Revelation (salvation-history's "wrap-up": the Final Conflict, the Return of Christ, and the Coming Kingdom of God);
- what the Bible teaches about women and their role and calling as spiritual and practical partners with men (especially as understood by Paul);

and, most recently,

• The Koran: understanding Muhammed, the roots & development of Islam, and its views on God, Jesus, salvation, & human purpose (as compared with the views of Christianity).

Next Fall we plan

- (a.) to study the New Testament as a whole (surveying each book individually) and
- (b.) comparing the biblical worldview with the emerging ideologies of Wokism, Transgenderism, and the Post-Modern revolt against "reason" and "authority" as cultural norms.

Accomplishments over last year:

- Annual fall and spring cleanup. Geri does a great job organizing this event and Niki makes a great breakfast for the early birds. We always have a great turnout.
- Last summer we had the parking lot potholes patched, large cracks filled, seal coated and repainted.
- Last summer we worked with a contractor to provide better water runoff for the slope on the
 east side of the sanctuary. Early spring rains had occasionally flooded the lower level. The slope
 was graded away from the building and the sidewalk was removed. However, the contractor
 could not get concrete due to material shortages, so Buck Landscaping saved the day and
 installed a paver block walkway.
- Doug replaced all sinks in the Genesis restrooms.
- We hired a plumber to fix leaky toilets in lower-level restrooms.
- Doug's ongoing maintenance and repairs.
- Audrey and Steve interviewed various insurance companies. We will be changing to Brotherhood Ins. for a savings of \$1500 annually and better coverage.
- There are many annual inspections required, including the kitchen, elevator, fire sprinklers, fire extinguishers, fire panels, fire dept inspector.
- Will soon be requesting quotes for the annual snow removal contract.
- Working through the details for adding CC cameras to the Genesis bldg.

YOUTH

We are taking a break for July and August and encouraging small group leaders to organize organic hang out times with their small groups. We are currently discussing with the elders about some potential changes for next fall and are excited about the possibilities of working with and supporting NCS.

We sincerely desire His presence and will not compromise in our familial and intergenerational pursuit of Him. Geri was instrumental in carrying a vision for what Health Ministry is doing and providing invaluable support to HM's founding and first few years. Thank you so much Geri for carrying this vision before the Lord and all the energy you invested.

OUTREACH/EVANGELISM

Over the past year, we have been working to implement a BLESS style and culture of outreach, hoping to take it from being a method, to being a lifestyle. Even as we transition into our season of new leadership, there have been many opportunities to bear good fruit along the way, both in strategic ministry partnership outreaches, as well as Way of the Lord sponsored events, such as Holy Spirit Night, and the Garage Sale Outreach.

Quotes from Garage Sale Team Summary: The team shared testimony of having gospel conversations and handing out the gospel flyer to numerous people. There were the congregation members at the gate engaging with people. A lady named Amber wanted to meet and talk more. Brian N and Leon engaged with a couple that were open to the gospel and surrendered their lives to Christ! Chris Ferrar talked about the atmosphere in this area, with the years of intercession and worship, the cover of darkness is thin! As my teammate Romona and I were coming back for debrief I sensed the Lord gave a word for the congregation —steward. A garage sale shopper referenced WOTL as a hub.

There was also an amazing report from Joey Stontz, regarding the spike in hits on the church website, directly correlating with the garage sale event. All of the events in the last year have birthed salvation and discipleship, and can be easily replicated and duplicated exponentially. As we implement this coming year's calendar and programs, our plan is to introduce the BLESS model via the pulpit and classroom teaching, along with testimony and lifestyle application. We want to be deliberate to BLESS people at every level of our fellowship: Begin with prayer, Listen with care, Eat together, Serve in love, and Share the story - BLESS.

FOOD SHELF

- Designed & Completed 17'x34' addition mostly volunteer pd. for roof framing & finishing
- Donations received \$5,000 grant from Second Harvest & \$25,000 from Blaine Charitable Gambling Fund, & designated gifts
- Need to finish: siding/soffit/gutters hiring crew and deacons decision on changing siding materials
- Last item seal the perimeter wall/floor joints & floor of addition.
- Have used new space since March for storage & Client check-in
- Rearranged existing space to accommodate all food inside & more families
- Now seeing 150+ families between 2:30 & 5:30+ PM = approx. 30% increase in one year
- Now serving the Hispanic Church when open on Sundays

- Challenge need for more afternoon workers (talk to Geri), increased food and utility costs
- Stats: in the past year we have Served 3,682 children, 4,877 adults & 1,463 Seniors for a total of over \$10,000 (that we know of)
- Average 20-25 new families each month
- Handled and given out 468,756 pounds of food = 234.4 TONS
- Distributed 17,000 diapers (individual not bags)
- Volunteer hours number in the thousands
